Integrated Planning in South Africa

- Durban in South Africa is very complex:
 - Sewered city centre
 - Informal settlements within 5 km of the city center
 - Rural areas within 20km of the city
 - Challenge for providing sanitation services to all



Integrated Planning in South Africa

Durban is innovative

- Urine Diversion Dehydrating Toilets (UDDTs)

Durban is adaptive

- Realization that faecal sludge from UDDTs and pit latrines requires management



Integrated Planning in South Africa

Durban is integrative

- Integration of the civil society, universities, research institutes and the private sector

Durban is innovative

- Collection and transport models for faecal sludge and urine
- Piloting of new treatment technologies and use options for faecal sludge
 - LaDePa
 - Black soldier fly larvae

- Providing equitable services to all requires community engagement, education and a variety of solutions
 - Ablutions blocks for dense informal settlements

City	Institutional arrangement	Sanitation tariff	Treatment technologies	
Dumaguete (120k people)	Public-sector partnership	0.02 USD/m ³ water	Faecal sludge	Non-mechanized dewatering, lagoons and wetlands
San Fernando (250k people)	Public-private partnership	Flat property tax	Faecal sludge	Partially-mechanized dewatering, anaerobic baffled reactor and lagoons
Manila Water – Dagatdagatan (1.5+ Mio. people)	Private company, in concession with national government	20% of water bill	Faecal sludge & Waste water	Mechanized dewatering, lagoons and wetlands
Manila Water – South (1.5+ Mio. people)				Mechanized dewatering, activated sludge
